What happens if I cannot attend?

If you are unable to keep your appointment, please let us know as soon as possible. You can cancel your appointment, but you need to give more than 24 hours notice so that we can offer the appointment to someone else and rebook you a new appointment.

If you cancel on more than one consecutive occasion you may be discharged.

If you fail to attend your first appointment you will not be offered any further appointments and will be discharged.

Your referrer will be notified. If you still require an appointment you will need to be re-referred back into the service and will be put back on the waiting list.

Patient identifiable information

Information about you is always treated as confidential. Sometimes, in order to provide safe, high quality care, the gynaecology team may need to communicate with other professionals looking after you (e.g. other, doctors, nurses or social care professionals).

Wherever possible, we will only share information with your consent.

Whenever we use your personal information we will always follow the Data Protection Act guidelines.
