Who are the Community Respiratory Team?

We are a team of specialist nurses with broad nursing experience and specialised respiratory skills which also include physiotherapists and clinical support workers. We provide education and support for patients, GPs and community teams on the management of chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) and other breathing or respiratory conditions.

We offer...

- Support on discharge from hospital
- Exercise and education programmes (pulmonary rehabilitation) in the community
- Follow up for those on long term oxygen therapy
- Appointments in your own home or clinic
- Working closely with you, your GP and your hospital consultant to try and improve your symptoms and quality of life
- An E-Referral into the integrated service

Aim of the service

The Community Respiratory Team provides a specialist service targeting the management of COPD in the community. The aim of the service is to improve the quality of life of patients with COPD, enhancing self-management and providing patient choice.

What to expect on a home visit / clinic

The first time we see you we will carry out a full assessment of your lungs so we can get to know you and your symptoms better. This helps us to tailor your care and make sure it's right for you.

This may include:

- Inhaler advice
- Nebuliser advice
- Use of antibiotics and steroids
- Chest auscultation (listening to your chest)
- Oxygen levels
- Self-management
- Referral to pulmonary rehabilitation classes
- Smoking cessation
- Psychological assessment
